On issues such as the Ukraine crisis and the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, China has always been a force for peace and justice by upholding an objective and fair position and by promoting peace and negotiation.

China has always adhered to the principle of extensive consultation, joint contribution and shared benefits and has promoted the improvement of global governance. Since the beginning of the new era, China has put forward important concepts and major initiatives such as building a new type of international relations, building a community with a shared future for mankind, championing for humanity's common values, the Belt and Road Initiative, the Global Development Initiative, the Global Security Initiative and the Global Civilization Initiative, which have given a new connotation to the Five Principles of Peaceful Coexistence, and have injected positive energy into the unstable and uncertain world.
